Thank you for agreeing to write this review for *Canadian Slavonic Papers*. Unless otherwise agreed, it will be due two months from the day you received the book. If you expect a delay, please let us know, so that we may agree on a new deadline.

Here are a few guidelines to assist you in writing and submitting your review:

Reviews should be between 500 and 800 words long. If a book is a collection of essays, the word limit is 1000. The editors reserve the right to shorten any excessively long review. Note that reviews are not returned to authors after editing.

At the top of the review, please list the bibliographic information in the following format:

First Name Last name. *Title.* Series information if any. Place: Publisher, year. Page information [roman, arabic]. Additional features [illustrations, bibliography, index]. Price, cloth. Price, paper. [or: Cloth. or: Paper.]

E.g.: **Christine D. Worobec, ed.** *The Human Tradition in Imperial Russia*. The Human Tradition Around the World. Lanham, Maryland: Rowman & Littlefield, 2009. xvii, 179 pp. Map. Index. \$69.00, cloth.

Please double-space, using Times New Roman 12 pt. font. We use Canadian spellings (modified British) and your review will be edited to reflect this.

Reviews generally should not have footnotes. References to specific points in the book under review can be made as follows: (p. 120) or (pp. 37-45).

Please italicize foreign terms, rather than underlining. We use the Library of Congress transliteration system.

At the bottom of your review, please list your name and affiliation, flush right. Affiliation should be italicized.

Please save your review in the following format: [year of book's publication] [book's author] [name of the reviewer]. E.g.: 2005 Smith Krys.

When your review is ready, please e-mail it as an attachment to Dr. Alison Rowley (History and Social Sciences, profarowley@gmail.com), Dr. Kate Holland (Literature and the Arts kate.holland@utoronto.ca) or Dr. Elisabeth Elliott (Language and Linguistics, eelliott@northwestern.edu). We use MS Word, but also accept WordPerfect or .rtf files. If your text includes diacritical marks or Cyrillic characters and you are unable to send it to us in Word format, please inform us by e-mail and we will sent you a mailing address for the submission of a hard copy.
