Workplace drug testing is commonly used in Canadian occupational settings, and has increasingly become the subject of ethical and legal challenges. Establishment of toxicological drug testing implores in-depth consideration of subjects' human rights. If not resolved appropriately, it may foreseeably increase risk and potential liability. Knowledge of the potential ethical and legal pitfalls, as well as the establishment of appropriate medical and ethics oversight in workplace drug policy development, is vital for ensuring a sound and defensible model.
