Recently, she published two books: *Alberta's Francophones* and *Un passé métis au féminin*. She has also published articles on the Métis, Contemporary Aboriginal Art as well as the Calgary School. She is involved in several research projects pertaining to the Métis as well as a biography on the Oblate missionary, Albert Lacombe. Her areas of interests are Métis issues (Historical and Contemporary), Aboriginal constitutional issues, Contemporary Aboriginal Art and Aboriginal Women's Issues.
