

CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY COURSES AT ST. STEPHEN'S COLLEGE

UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA B.A. MINOR IN CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY

The Faculty of Arts at the University of Alberta offers an interdisciplinary minor in Christian Theology through a combination of courses from St. Stephen's College, St. Joseph's College, the Faculty of Arts Interdisciplinary Studies programs, and the Department of History and Classics. A minimum of *18 to a maximum of *42 credits at the senior level in designated courses, including at least *12 in CHRTP and/or CHRTC and *9 at the 300 or 400 level, is required. A listing of these courses can be obtained from the Undergraduate Student Services Office of the Faculty of Arts. It is recommended that students include RELIG101, CHRTC100, and two of CLASS110, HIST110, or HIST111 in their program. The Dean of St. Joseph's College (492-7681 ext 227) serves as student advisor.

CHRTP301 HEBREW SCRIPTURE BASICS

Sep 2 - Dec 2 (Wed 2-5pm) #30712

Explores basic themes and literature of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament): sources and context, authorship, literary qualities, general teaching and formation. The Hebrew Bible will be placed in its historical context and attention will be given to its literary forms and its theological concerns, all of which will be discussed in light of on-going scholarly research.

CHRTP318 FEMINIST THEOLOGY

Sep 3 - Dec 3 (Thurs 2-5pm) #30714

An examination of feminist criticisms of selected doctrines and practices. Through a feminist process of learning, participants will reflect creatively on assigned readings and relate their personal experiences to the course. Some of the topics covered: Language: naming the Holy and naming ourselves, Theological reflection, Women of the Scriptures, Goddess religions past and present, Mystics, Sisterhood from African and Asian perspectives, and Eco-feminism.

CHRTP305 CHRISTIAN SCRIPTURE BASICS

Jan 11 - Apr 12 (Mon 5-8pm) #50460

Explores basic themes and literature of the New Testament. Christianity's origins and the social formation of Jesus movements and Christ cults are explored in the context of the Jewish, Greek and Roman world.

CHRTP316 "JUST" SEX: INTEGRATING SEXUALITY AND SPIRITUALITY

(Previously titled "Issues in Contemporary Sexuality and Spirituality")

Jan 5 - Apr 6 (Tues 3-6pm) #50462

This course seeks to explore questions of justice in relation to sexuality and spirituality through the historical/theological aspects of our lives in light of contemporary theory and debate.

CHRTP315 EXPLORING FAITH AND FICTION

(Previously titled "Topics in Religion and Literature")

Jan 6 - Apr 7, 2010 (Wed 2-5pm) #50461

Novels chosen present us with questions of doubt and faith, spiritual journey, community. In addition to exploring these questions, attention will be paid to the transmission and transformation of values, and the use of literature as a religious vehicle for social change.
