The <u>8th Canadian Forum on Inter-Church Dialogues</u> (CFICD) will take place **June 8-10, 2023, in Edmonton**. This conference, organized by <u>The Canadian Council of Churches</u> in partnership with <u>The Prairie Centre for Ecumenism</u> and <u>The Canadian Centre for Ecumenism</u>, is **open to anyone interested in the ecumenical movement or in this year's theme**.

The theme of the conference – V">a² / Pêhonân – A Gathering-Waiting Place: Voices of Indigenous Followers of Jesus in the Ecumenical Movement – calls us into a deeper understanding and appreciation of the wisdom, gifts, and experiences that Indigenous followers of Jesus can offer the ecumenical movement. Participants will hear from a wide range of Indigenous church leaders from different nations and denominational perspectives on what Christian division and Christian unity mean for them, participate in ceremony and worship in a variety of Indigenous and Settler expressions of Christianity, and engage in workshops on ecumenical topics.
