- Certificates are awarded at the annual SJC Commencement Celebration being held this year on Saturday, April 13th, 2024. All students in the Certificate program will receive a formal invitation.
- This application form can be submitted at any time during your Certificate coursework however applying early is encouraged to stay connected to related events, awards and learning opportunities.
- The required courses for the Certificate in Catholic Education must be taken within a five-year period. The Certificate will not be awarded retroactively for courses taken five years prior to submitting this application.
- The Certificate in Catholic Education provides an additional credential on your resume and demonstrates your desire to teach in a Catholic school. It is an asset but not a requirement.
- Students pursuing a continuous contract in the Edmonton Catholic School District, Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools or Elk Island Catholic Schools must however take CHRTC 250 and one of either CHRTC 380 or CHRTC 381 towards obtaining a continuous contract (or approved equivalents).

ABOUT THE COURSES

CHRTC 100: The Bible: An Introduction

A study of the basic themes of the Christian Bible; creation and covenant; sin and evil; the biblical history of ancient Israel; the prophets and justice; the preaching, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ; redemption; the emergence of the Church.

CHRTC 250: The Theological Education of the Catholic Teacher

The components that make up the education of the Catholic teacher. Issues include credal statements, the moral and social teachings of the Church, liturgical practices, a general theology and theory of Catholic education.

CHRTC 380: Teaching Religion: Elementary

An introduction to Christian religious education for secondary schools with an emphasis on pedagogy, adolescent and young adult development and the religious education curriculum.

CHRTC 381: Teaching Religion: Secondary

An introduction to Christian religious education for secondary schools with an emphasis on pedagogy, adolescent and young adult development and the religious education curriculum. This course is structured to support aspiring secondary teachers to develop an elective religious education program.

CHRTC 410: Integrative Learning in Catholic Education

An integrative course on theory in Catholic education and course-based experiences in local schools. Historical, educational, and professional issues are examined through theological reflection.

This course will include a practical experience in a Catholic School.

Please note: the four required courses for the Certificate in Catholic Education do not include formal prerequisites however it is advised that they be taken in successive order.
