IN URGENT RESPONSE TO THE "PROPOSED RESOLUTION RESPECTING THE
CONSTITUTION OF CANADA," 1980, THE BRITISH COLUMBIA HUMAN RIGHTS
SYMPOSIUM UNANIMOUS AGREED THAT:

1. THE PROPOSED CHARTER OF RIGHTS AND FREEDOMS IS NOT ACCEPTABLE
2. A PERIOD OF 6 ADDITIONAL MONTHS MUST BE ALLOWED FOR THE CANADIAN
PUBLIC TO STUDY THE PROPOSED CHARTER AND TO PREPARE RECOMMENDATIONS
FOR SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENTS
