

The design of the 2010 Formula SAE car has been finalized, and we now await our Critical Design Review. The design for all aspects of the car will be scrutinized by Curt Stout, a Department Engineer for the faculty of Mechanical Engineering. Our major design changes this year involve a shorter and wider wheelbase to improve cornering and a modified design for the intake to maximize the potential of our 600cc en-

gine. We are improving our design every year by buildupon the previous ina years' design. Our goals for 2010 are to reduce the overall weight of the car by 3% and yet increase power and torque to over 80 hp and 45 ft-lbs. Packaging for 2010 will be more compact accommodate to our shorter wheelbase and chassis. We are looking forward to a year of building, testing and competition.
