



# Plagiarism

## Plagiarism

- ❖ If you use someone else's exact words without putting them in "quotation marks", that's plagiarism.
- ❖ If you use someone else's idea paraphrased in your own words without indicating where you got the idea, that's plagiarism.
- ❖ If you use data you didn't collect yourself and don't give credit to your source, that's plagiarism.
- ❖ If you use pictures, graphics, images or graphs that you didn't create on your own and don't state where you got them, that's plagiarism.

In other words, ANYTHING you submit as part of a course or program of study that doesn't credit any other sources you've used is assumed to be your own work. Therefore, you **MUST** credit the sources you use. It's the respectful thing to do and it's good academic practice.

### Code of Student Behaviour - Plagiarism

§30.3.2(1): No student shall submit the words, ideas, images or data of another person as the Student's own in any academic writing, essay, thesis, project, assignment, presentation or poster in a course or program of study.
