In 1967 the Canadian delegates at the Pi Beta Phi convention adopted the northern literacy project Arrow in the Arctic. To commemorate the 40th anniversary of this selection a new logo has been adopted by Grand Council. The original design by Patricia

Dunn, an Illinois Zeta, will be retired to Pi Beta Phi archives.

Since 1967 our Canadian philanthropy has grown to support 24 northern communities, which are traditionally underserved in funding, resources and, of course, books. One

library was delighted to purchase a rug for their children's section. It may sound simple but in light of sitting on a cold concrete floor our support is invaluable to a population that will now develop a love of reading and excel through literacy!

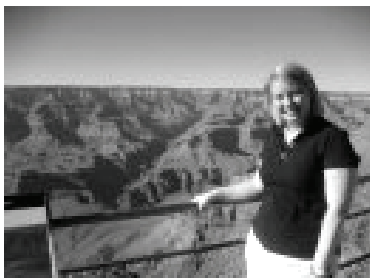

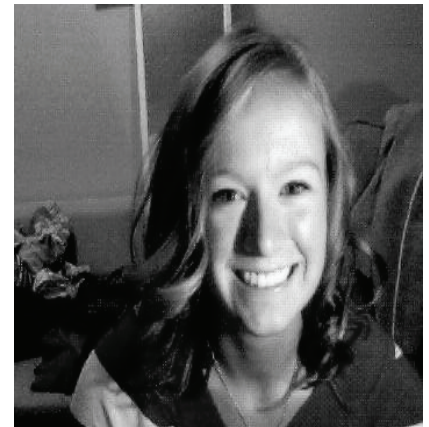
