

Post-Doctoral Fellowship Opportunity – Applied Statistics and Epidemiology

Applications are invited for a post-doctoral opportunity in applied statistics and epidemiology. The successful applicant will be involved in the analysis of large, comprehensive, administrative data sets related to pediatric mental health (Children's Mental Health Compass, EDCompass.net).

The work will be conducted under the supervision of Profs. Rhonda J. Rosychuk and Amanda S. Newton in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Alberta. The primary responsibilities are to: conduct literature searches and reviews, perform basic statistical analyses, aid in the preparation of presentations and manuscripts, assist in grant applications, and participate in knowledge translation activities. This fellowship provides a unique opportunity for the applicant learn skills related to administrative data, knowledge translation, health services, and pediatric mental health.

Qualified applicants should have: a PhD in epidemiology, statistics, or a related field (or near completion), excellent oral and written communication skills. Support will be provided for an initial period and the successful applicant will work with the supervisors to obtain additional potential funding sources and prepare applications for additional periods of support. Sources include fellowships from [Alberta Innovates – Health Solutions](http://AlbertaInnovates-HealthSolutions.ca) and [Canadian Institutes of Health Research](http://CanadianInstitutesofHealthResearch.ca). These fellowships are highly competitive and applicants are encouraged to review the eligibility criteria and application instructions.
