**1 Administration (ADM)** ●  
Your first tour stop and home of **Student Connect**, the Office of the Registrar student services centre. Advisors are on hand to answer questions about admissions, registration, financial support, transcripts, forms, and more. No need for an appointment — just show up!

**2 Students' Union Building (SUB)** ●●●  
Owned and operated by the **Students' Union**, SUB houses the SU's services, study spaces, and a variety of tasty dining options. Also located in SUB is **First Peoples' House**, which provides an environment of empowerment for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit (FNMI) learners to achieve personal and academic growth.

**3 Van Vliet Complex (VVC)** ●●●  
Van Vliet has everything you need to get in shape, including an indoor track, multiple swimming pools, a fully-loaded gym, and climbing centre with over 7,000 square feet of high wall climbing!  
Cheer on the **U of A Golden Bears and Pandas** teams at one of the many varsity games throughout the year.

**4 Butterdome (PAV)** ●  
This pavilion contains full-scale track and field facilities as well as numerous ball courts. Attend year-round tournaments and **special events** here.

**5 Lister Centre** ●●●  
Lister Centre is a dedicated **first-year residence** on campus. Here students can live, study, and make lifelong friends from around the world. Specialized programming within an inclusive community support success in the first year.

**6 Edmonton Clinic Health Academy (ECHA)** ●●●  
ECHA is where students, researchers, and educators engage in all health science programs.

**7 Education Centre (ED)** ●●●  
The North and South Education Centre belongs to tomorrow's inspiring teachers. The north side of the facility has a mural titled "West and North" by Norman Yates.

**8 Fine Arts Building (FAB)** ●●●  
FAB houses the Art and Design, Drama, and Music departments. It includes a printmaking studio, movement /dance studios, costume workshops, and a large music library. Take in an art show at the FAB Gallery while you're here!

**9 Timms Centre for the Arts (TC)** ●●●  
Timms Centre is home to the Studio Theatre, the U of A's very own theatre company. Here you can catch student-led theatre productions throughout the academic year!

**10 Telus Centre (TEL)** ●●●  
Telus Centre is home to the **UAlberta International Services Centre**, which provides international students with resources to help them adjust to life at the U of A and in Canada.

**11 Upper-Year Residence Community** ●●●  
Live in one of the best neighbourhoods in Edmonton, right on campus! Live independently or share space with friends, from studios to six-bedroom apartments. Upper-year residences are located at this stop (outlined in green) and HUB.

**12 Housing Union Building (HUB)** ●●●  
This bustling centre was designed to model both a city street and a skyscraper on its side! Straddling two city blocks, HUB contains numerous dining options, residence apartments, and student services (including the **ONECard office**).

**13 Rutherford Library (RN & RS)** ●  
As the U of A's Humanities and Social Sciences library, Rutherford Library is the **largest library on campus** and the second-largest research library in Canada.

**14 Alberta School of Business (BUS)** ●  
Here you'll find the Alberta School of Business, one of the world's leading institutions of business education and research.

**15 Tory Building (T)** ●  
Named for Henry Marshall Tory, the first president of the university, this building is home to many of the U of A's social science departments and the Archaeology lab.

**16 Old Arts Building or Convocation Hall (A)** ●●  
Built in 1915 and once the centre of campus, today the Old Arts Building is mainly used for music recitals and concerts for special ceremonies.

**17 Central Academic Building (CAB)** ●●●●  
CAB is a common meeting area for students from all faculties. The newly-renovated lower level features a large cafeteria and seating area.

**18 Centennial Centre for Interdisciplinary Science (CCIS)** ●●●●  
CCIS is home to the Faculty of Science. This state-of-the-art facility allows for collaboration between scientists, world-class researchers, and brilliant students. CCIS contains an observatory as well as the Student Innovation Centre.

**19 Main Quad** ●  
The biggest **green space** on campus! In warm weather, you'll see students lounging, playing frisbee, or hurrying to their next class. In winter, enjoy the sparkling lights and blanket of snow.

**20 Pembina Hall (PB)** ●  
Built in 1914, Pembina Hall is one of the U of A's oldest buildings. It is home to the first Faculty of Native Studies in North America.

**21 Donadeo Innovation Centre for Engineering** ●●  
This building is home to all Engineering student offices and the DiscoverE outreach program. Head to the 8th floor Fred Phaesey Student Common for a majestic view of the city's river valley and downtown skyline.

**22 Engineering Teaching and Learning Complex (ETLC)** ●●  
ETLC is a state-of-the-art facility with classrooms, laboratories, engineering student clubs, and a food court. Here you'll find the Elko Engineering Garage, a 6,000 sq. ft. makerspace where students can bring their designs to life.

**23 Agriculture / Forestry Centre (AF)** ●  
Home to the Faculty of Agriculture, Life & Environmental Sciences, this centre contains teaching labs, a food processing pilot plant, and an 8,000 sq. ft. greenhouse facility on the top floor.

## ONLY AT THE U OF A

**A Sweetgrass Bear**  
Created by Stewart Steinhauer, this sculpture is part of the university's efforts for meaningful reconciliation with Indigenous peoples by acting as a lasting reminder that we are all treaty people.

**B "Harry Potter Room"**  
Located in Rutherford South, this **study hall** has been affectionately deemed the "Harry Potter Room" by many of the students who study here.

**C Tipi**  
A **sign of welcoming** for First Nations peoples on campus, the Faculty of Native Studies' Tipi is raised every spring and left up for the summer months as a marker for Indigenous presence on campus.

**D CCIS Terrazzo Floor**  
Embedded with **science-related concepts**, this floor was created from mining byproducts and recycled car windshields. A plesiosaur skeleton is also located in this building.
