

STUDY ABROAD OR WITHIN CANADA.

Study outside the classroom and earn credit toward your degree at the same time. From a few weeks in a field school to spending several semesters abroad, there are many possibilities to explore.

EXCHANGE

Take courses at a partner university for a semester or a full year. Change your scenery and attend the University of Wollongong in Australia, an ecologically designed campus in the foothills of the Mt. Keira rainforest, overlooking the Pacific Ocean.

INTERNSHIP

Choose a 4 to 8-month work placement with a private company, organization, or a research placement at a university. Conduct research in world-class laboratories in Aachen, Germany.


GET A HEAD START ON YOUR CAREER

U of A's International Student Services offers support with pathways to Canadian permanent residency.





Located a few hours away from Edmonton is Canada's world famous Banff National Park. Experience stunning peaks, beautiful lakes, and ancient glaciers.



OPTIONS FOR EVERYONE

There are residence options for students on all U of A campuses.

OTHER CAMPUSES

Augustana Campus is located in the city of Camrose, approximately an hour's drive from Edmonton. Augustana residents enjoy a dormitory environment with a strong community in the centre of campus, just a short walk from classes and the many on-campus activities.

Campus Saint-Jean is located in Edmonton's French Quarter, about 15 minutes from North Campus. Francophone residents of Résidence Saint-Jean will appreciate the architecture of the historic original building, where no two rooms are alike and every room is private.

LIVE ON CAMPUS FOR YOUR WHOLE DEGREE

After your first year at the University of Alberta, stay on campus and live in one of our upper year residences. There are many options available for all your campus housing requirements.

APPLY EARLY

You do not need an offer of admission to apply to live in residence.

Apply by April 30, 2022 to guarantee your spot.

FIRST-YEAR RESIDENTS

Get more out of your university experience by living in residence! Living on campus in residence puts you right in the centre of all the University of Alberta has to offer. Specialized residence programming is part of living in residence and supports your success in all aspects of your campus life—including academics, community and your health.

Lister Centre and Peter Lougheed Hall are the primary residences for first year students, located on the UAlberta North Campus. Both single (private) and shared rooms are available. Students looking for a meal-plan optional community may also apply for Nipisiy House or St. Joseph's Residence.

RATE ESTIMATES

First year students; dormitory style rooms: \$1,537–\$2,401/month (includes rent, meal plan and programming), depending on residence and room type. Upper-year students; apartment style units: \$800–\$1,649/month.

MEAL PLANS & FOOD OPTIONS

First year residence in Lister Centre and Peter Lougheed Hall includes a meal plan. This means that you can focus on your classes and friends instead of shopping for groceries, cooking and doing dishes. Gluten free, halal, vegetarian and vegan are among the many options available each day.

Other first year communities offer you all the benefits of life in residence with the option to cook for yourself. If you live in a residence that does not include a meal plan, you can purchase a voluntary meal plan to use in the residence dining halls. You can also enjoy a meal at one of the many restaurants on campus or shop at a local grocery store and prepare your own meals.

PROGRAMMING

Research indicates that students in residence are in a better position to succeed academically! Our Academic in Residence (a university Ph.D. student) and peer tutor program are just two ways we are here to help improve and support your academic skills.

BEGIN AT BASECAMP

Moving out on your own and starting university are two big life changes. Attending BaseCamp residence orientation will help you get started: A week before classes start, you'll move in, meet your floormates, get to know campus and explore the city. It's more than an orientation—it's a head start on how to excel as a first year student.

Your admission comes with a tuition guarantee. As an international student at the U of A you will know the total tuition for your program when you receive admission.

TUITION GUARANTEE DETAILS

- Your tuition guarantee only applies to the standard requirements, including electives, necessary to complete your program. It does not include any mandatory non-instructional fees or other costs such as the U-Pass, textbooks, residence fees, students associations, etc. It also does not include the cost for any courses you choose to take as extra or that need to be repeated due to withdrawal or failure.
- If you choose to take Spring/Summer courses, your total program tuition will remain the same however your annual total will increase for that year.
- Your tuition guarantee is set for the typical duration of your program plus one year. Typically programs are four years, therefore the guarantee would be in place for five years.
- Should you require a fifth year of study to complete your program requirements, you will not face additional tuition costs in that fifth year. If your remaining courses exceed your program requirements, you will pay per course. In either case, payment for mandatory non-instructional fees in the fifth year will be required. If you have outstanding program requirements to complete after five years you will be required to pay for those remaining courses, individually, at the current rate in that academic year.
- If you change programs at the University of Alberta your original guarantee will no longer be valid, and you will receive a new guarantee for your new program.
- In the event of a discrepancy between the tuition amounts displayed in this publication and your University of Alberta Offer of Admission, the Offer of Admission shall be taken as correct.

AFTER YOU APPLY: EVALUATION

Admission to the U of A is competitive and works on a rolling basis — some students could receive an admission offer as early as October. Admission averages are calculated using the five required courses for your program of choice using the courses and final marks included on your application. Where final Grade 12 marks are unavailable, the final mark in the equivalent Grade 11 course will be used. Admission offers could be based on final Grade 11 marks.
