

POSTDOCTORAL POSITIONS IN THE FACULTY OF EDUCATION

The University of Alberta Faculty of Education invites applications for up to five postdoctoral fellow positions. The U of A is one of the top three Canadian graduate Faculties of Education. Our programs span all areas of educational studies: curriculum theory and curricular studies in all subject areas and levels of schooling; educational policy, administration, and foundations; educational psychology; library and information studies; and health sciences. We honour diversity and seek to prepare our 900 graduate students for leadership positions nationally and internationally.

A total of up to five PDF appointments will be made across our departments. These five positions are intended for beginning scholars to engage in their individual research and to participate in and contribute to the vibrant community of scholars. We anticipate substantial positive impact as we place beginning scholars in areas that have great potential and expertise but also a need to rebuild capacity due to recent retirements.

We seek candidates who are committed to research and teaching in a diverse, collaborative, and collegial environment. One position may be allotted to each of the following departments:

- The Department of Educational Policy Studies: has four areas of specialization. Applicants should state their research interests and in which area their program of study aligns: Adult, Community and Higher Education; Educational Administration and Leadership; Indigenous Peoples Education; and Theory, Cultural and International Studies in Education. http://www.edpolicystudies.ualberta.ca
- The Department of Educational Psychology: The Department of Educational Psychology invites applications for study in the areas of Counselling Psychology, Measurement, Evaluation and Cognition, School and Clinical Child Psychology, Special Education, and Teaching English as a Second Language. The intention of offering five postdoctoral fellowships concurrently is to enable beginning scholars to contribute to the overall priorities and success of the Faculty of Education, as well as to establish productive collaborations across disciplines. Successful applicants will conduct independent research; teach up to two courses per academic year; contribute service to the Faculty of Education and the particular department in which they are located; and participate in the preparation of presentations, grant proposals, and projects within the Faculty. The responsibilities will be approximately 60% research, 20% teaching, 20% service.

Duration: Two years, subject to satisfactory performance review following the first year.

Start date: July 1, 2016

Citizenship restrictions: Canadian and permanent resident

Stipend: \$62 000.00 CDN annually, plus one-time research allowance of \$3 500.00 CDN. The Faculty of

Education pays the cost of the University Postdoc Supplemental Health Insurance Plan.
