FILM STUDIES MAJOR COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

A major in Film Studies requires a minimum of 11 courses, including 10 courses at the senior level, to a maximum of 16 courses in Film Studies.

- FS 100 - Introduction to Film Study
- Three courses at the 200-level
- Four courses at the 300-level
- Three courses at the 400-level.

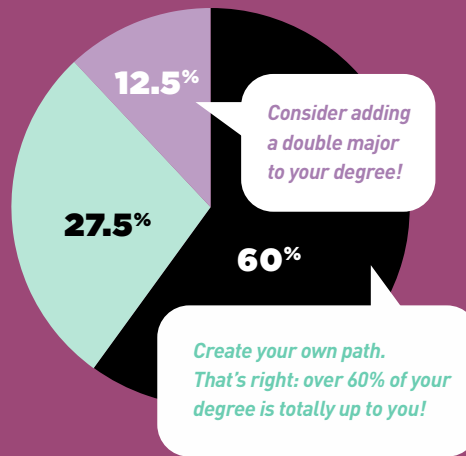
