



## CILLDI 2020: Questions about Online Courses

### *How can I register?*

This summer's courses are available to learn anywhere with our online format! If you are already a University of Alberta student, you can enrol by emailing [cilldi@ualberta.ca](mailto:cilldi@ualberta.ca).

If you are not currently a UofA student, you will need to apply for admission. You can learn more about this by email or on our [website](#).

### *What is happening with the bursary programs?*

The [Provost Bursary program](#) is re-opening! It will cover the recipient's application fee (if necessary), tuition, and fees for two courses—there is no stipend for housing/expenses in Edmonton this year. Apply by **May 22, 2020** if you have not already applied.

The ILE Bursary is continuing this summer for past recipients of that bursary. Tuition will be paid for, but stipends for housing/expenses in Edmonton are not available this summer.

### *What are the costs for online courses?*

The 2020 fees for CILLDI include the **application fee** (\$75 or \$125 if you are not currently a UofA student), **tuition** (\$1,064.16), and reduced **student fees** (\$358.14).

### *What will I need to take an online course?*

**You must have reliable access to a home computer and the internet, preferably high-speed (cable or DSL).** Speakers, headphones, and/or a webcam and microphone may be needed for some course components. Consider your access to a printer/scanner if you prefer reading or doing homework with paper.

### *How will the courses be formatted?*

Courses may be formatted differently depending on what works best to teach that material. Some may try to meet online to discuss, while others might have you work entirely on your own schedule. As instructors develop their courses, we will provide more details about this.



### *What kind of support will I have as an online student?*

All students will have regular online access to CILLDI staff, volunteers, and the university for technological support or class questions. You will also be working through your course alongside your instructor and your classmates—you are not alone! See the next page to get to know us in advance!

### *Can I study and work with my peers, friends, and family?*

Like in a classroom, we encourage students to discuss and share with their peers and friends! (Depending on where you are, this may be best done online to maintain physical distance.) However, for assignments, please remember that you will need to submit your own, individual work.

### *What courses will be offered?*

We will be offering 7 courses this summer: LING 111, LING 211, LING 212, LING 213, EDEL 306, EDEL 461, and EDEL 496 (Leadership in Language and Culture Education). You can read short descriptions [here](#). More details soon!

### *When will the classes take place?*

Courses will be active over the two months of the Summer semester (**July-August**). Exact dates will depend on which course(s) you decide to take. Some will run over 3 weeks (July 6-24 OR July 27-August 12) and others are be offered over 6 weeks (July 6-August 12).

### *How many courses can I take online?*

You can still take up to **two courses** this summer. Depending on whether they're 3 or 6-weeks, you may take two at the same time or one after the other (for example, LING 111 then 211).

We recommend working 3 to 4 hours each day for each 3-week class. Each 6- week course will be about 1 to 2 hours of work per day.

### *How will I submit homework?*

You can discuss what will work with your instructor, but for written assignments, you can use either a special keyboards or fonts to type in your language or submit scans/images of your handwritten work. More information on fonts will be provided in the coming weeks.
