

Three Research Directions



1. Immigration, Settlement, & SES Patterns of Post-1991 Immigrants


- One of the last major updates in 2002 (Isajiw, Satzewich, & Duvalko)
- The team will provide a nationally-representative analysis of post-1991 immigrant groups
- Longitudinal Immigrant Database (IMDB)
- Key characteristics assessed: i.e., employment income, educational attainment, inter-provincial mobility, family size over multiple decades





2. Integration into the Ukrainian Canadian community

- How integrated are the post-1991 immigrants from Ukraine into the Ukrainian Canadian community?
- Two-step approach
 - 1. Integration into the Ukrainian Canadian community the community perspective
 - 2. Integration into the Ukrainian Canadian community the **immigrants' perspective**
- The team plans to conduct organizational surveying to explore the integration of post-1991 migrants into select Ukrainian Canadian organizations





3. Analysis of Ukrainian immigrants and the Provincial Nominee Programs

- The Provincial Nominee Program
 - government program
- Using the statistical data from the Immigrant Longitudinal Database and analysis of available data on the provincial nominee program, our research will examine the work of the Canadian provincial nominee programs and their success at attracting Ukrainian immigrants and RETAINING them after 1991.





The Post-1991 Project at a Glance

As of October 2021:

- 8 project team meetings have taken place
- 3 key case studies have been identified and initiated
- 1 Government of Canada security clearance application was successful
- 30+ unique Ukrainian Canadian organizations from across the country have been identified and are to be engaged in the coming year

The Longitudinal Immigrant Data Base (IMDB)

- Links administrative immigration records and annual tax files
- Records have been linked for immigrant arrivals from 1982 to the present
- Contains data on permanent residents and non-permanent residents



What types of immigration data are included in the IMDB?

For permanent residents:

Admission category & date
Intended occupation
Knowledge of official language at admission
Country of birth, citizenship and last permanent residence
Intended place of residence in Canada

And more...

For non-permanent residents:

Document type
Study level & skill level
Effective and valid date



What are some of the tax data included in the IMDB for immigrants?

Individual and family level incomes

- Employment income
- Social assistance
- Industry of employment (NAICS)
- Tax credit for post-secondary education
- Place of residence for taxation year

Family composition for each tax year

- Family size
- Marital status, spousal identifier
- Number of children, by age
- Number of immigrants in the family



Access to data via Research Data Centres (RDCs)

- 30 RDCs across Canada
- Secure computer laboratories
- Strict access rules and protocols



How we did we define our study population?

The IMDB allows for use of:

- country of last residence
- country of citizenship
- country of birth















Ukrainian Immigration to Canada by Immigration Category, 1992-2019







Education Levels of Ukrainian Immigrants to Canada, 1992-2019




Knowledge of Official Languages of Ukrainian Immigrants, 1992 - 2019
