Information about Selecting Education Electives and Open Options

When selecting electives and options, you may wish to consider focusing on a specific topic by 'bundling' a number of relevant courses together to develop your capacity in that area. You might also wish to seek out volunteer or paid work experiences that focus on a specific area. For example, in recent conversations with representatives from the two metro-Edmonton school jurisdictions, they identified a number of areas in which they believe our preservice teachers would be well served by gaining additional knowledge, skills and experience, including:

- 1. Indigenous/Aboriginal Education
- 2. Early Childhood Education
- 3. English Language Learners and Culturally Diverse Schools
- 4. Special Education

Below is a list of some examples of Faculty of Education courses that align with each of four areas, but please note the following:

- The list is not exhaustive and there may be other relevant Education courses that do not appear.
- The list does not include potentially relevant courses from outside of the Faculty of Education.
- There is no guarantee that all of these course will be offered in any given term or even that they will be offered on an annual basis.
- The important thing is that you select courses that you see as being relevant to developing the capacities you will require as a teacher and that you can establish this connection when addressing potential employers.

Each key area listed below includes a required course indicated with an asterisk (*) as well as additional courses that could be selected to develop further knowledge on the topic. This is in no way a requirement or expectation and students are free to use these spaces as they see fit. Students will not be granted any formal credential or certificate for completing a certain number of courses in a particular area; however, work in the identified areas would be something to highlight during the application and interview process.
