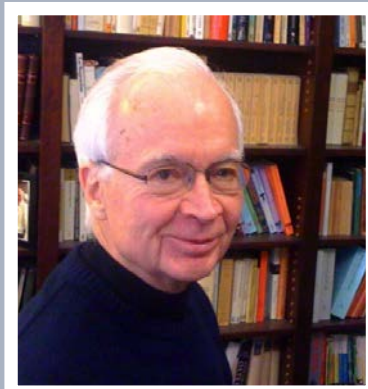

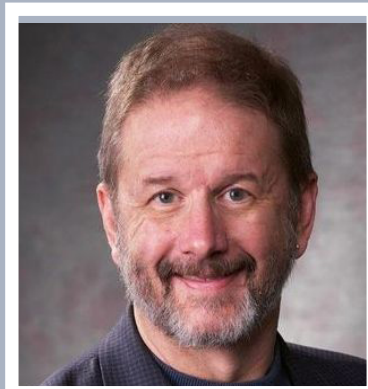


PARTICIPANTS:
