

ALL IN FOR YOUTH: THE ROAD TO RESILIENCE

ATTENDANCE 2024/25:

Consistent attendance is closely associated with higher academic achievement.



The 2024/25 data marks a positive shift in attendance, with an **82.5% AIFY ATTENDANCE RATE**.

While the district average is 87%, the narrowing of this gap is an indicator that **AIFY initiatives are successfully keeping students in school** despite the challenges in socially vulnerable communities.

MOBILITY 2024/25:

Student mobility refers to students transferring between schools or leaving the school system altogether, typically due to moving out of the catchment area, relocating from Edmonton, or dropping out.

Students who move frequently are more likely to struggle in school due to disrupted learning, difficulty maintaining peer relationships, and face a higher risk of falling behind.

The annual mobility rate of **Edmonton Public School Board** is **15.0%**.
The annual mobility rate of AIFY schools is 33.7%.

While student mobility has decreased from last year's high of 53.6%, AIFY schools still manage significantly more student mobility than the district average.

TRANSITION 2024/25:

Transition refers to moving to a new level of schooling, such as from elementary to junior high. This important step can be especially challenging for students already facing instability. New environments, teachers, and peer groups can impact both academic performance and wellbeing.

AIFY wraparound supports help ease this transition.



Elementary to Junior High successful transition rates
REACHED A FOUR-YEAR HIGH OF 89.9%.

Meanwhile,
88.4% OF AIFY JUNIOR HIGH STUDENTS SUCCESSFULLY TRANSITIONED TO HIGH SCHOOL IN 2024/25.

These figures indicate that **AIFY students who remain in the program are better prepared for the next level of their education**, so moving schools isn't a roadblock to academic progress.
