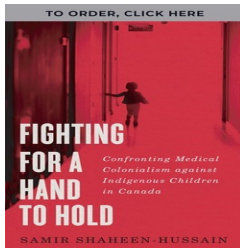

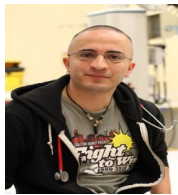

Show how a dominant "culture" can normalize oppression in healthcare and child welfare services by placing the medical establishment in historical, social and political context.
