RCIA UPDATE

The process of preparing young people for full membership in the Catholic Church is well underway. There is a mix between Catholics needing confirmation, people baptized in other traditions who wish to become Catholic, and those who will, God willing, receive the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and holy communion at the Easter Vigil. Most of them have been worshipping at our chapel for some time.

As a College community we have many resources for instructing those in the RCIA program. Alpha gives a basic instruction in the faith, and the Symbolon study group focuses on more specific topics, especially those related to the Creed. We have two upcoming retreats that are a help both to newcomers to the faith and to those who have been Catholic all their lives. The Catholic Students Association has a weekly bible study and prayer group, there are SJC classes on scripture, and Church history, and various other topics. Sister Elizabeth is available for spiritual direction, and either Fr. Warren or Fr. Jim is available for one on one conversation, or for speaking on topics of particular interest.

Each of our candidates (those already baptized) and catechumens (those needing all three sacraments of initiation) have sponsors who serve as "mass buddies" and someone to talk with about their faith. The sponsors are active, confirmed Catholics. They do not have all the answers to questions about the faith, but who does?

As of October 17 we have fifteen people (and one maybe) in the RCIA program. They are a sign of hope for all of us, a sign of how God is constantly renewing his church. Please remember them in your prayers.
