
SITE OVERVIEW

The Family Medicine-Westview Community Teaching Site (FM-Westview CTS) consists of six community-based family practice teaching clinics—as shown in the figure below—each a fee-for-service physician owned and managed family practice. Five clinics pursued primary care accreditation by Accreditation Canada in 2014-2019 and received “Accredited with Exemplary Standing” and “Accredited with Commendation” awards.

Site clinics are located at a 15-20-minute drive from west Edmonton. Together, the 6 clinics serve a panel of 53,368 patients, who are residents of the suburban/rural communities of Spruce Grove, Stony Plain, Parkland County and three First Nations (Enoch, Paul, and Alexis): 26% age 0-19 years, 60% 20-64 and 14% 65+. Approximately 5% are Treaty Status patients. The panel has a birth rate of 30/1,000 women, which is higher than the provincial rate. All 6 clinics are member clinics of the WestView Primary Care Network (PCN); and are resourced for collaborative practice with nursing, pharmacy, social work, mental health, and panel management professionals, among others, delivering care in the Patient’s Medical Home clinical environment.

Equipped with electronic medical record (EMR) systems with clinical and business auditing features, site clinics offer residents opportunities to design clinical quality improvement initiatives and to develop strategic business plans on aspects of running a medical practice. Further, the clinics’ busy community practice environment speeds the development of clinical acumen and prepares residents for varied and graduated patient volumes early on, building confidence for a resident-managed patient panel as experience grows.

RESIDENT OPPORTUNITIES

All preceptors provide comprehensive cradle to grave care to their patient panel, while individually equipped with expertise and experience in clinical area(s) of their special interest(s) as outlined below. Site preceptors have hospital admission privileges at either or both site-affiliated hospitals, offering continuity of care throughout the patient’s illness experience. Further, the site offers horizontal learning experiences in a wide range of clinical areas spanning from primary care specialties (women’s health, pediatrics asthma, obesity, chronic pain, youth mental health, office procedures, cast clinic, palliative care, First Nations family health and others), emergency medicine and inpatient hospital care, to IV Starts/Airway Management in the surgical suite. Site-based teaching activities include monthly rounds and semi-annual research/quality improvement forums, with presentations by both preceptors and residents.

Residents also participate in a tight-knit social environment through site-organized socials coinciding with research forums, a start of year welcome event, and interaction during site rounds and academic days. Resident organized activities, outings, and study groups occur throughout the year as well, creating a cohesive and supportive network throughout residency. Resident involvement in various outside positions including the FMRA and other organizations is supported and encouraged at Westview.
