#### Discussion.

In her comments, the Vice-Chair made note of the upcoming First Peoples' Annual Round Dance on January 28, and the Board, GFC, and Senate Summit on January 20.

Kate Peters, GFC Secretary provided an update on the new voting tool that was developed by Information Services and Technology (IST) and invited members to the test session on January 17.

Jeannie Smith, Chief of Staff in the office of the President was invited to provide an update on the University Secretary recruitment and selection process. She noted that the search committee was being formed and that the composition and timelines would be shared in the next few weeks. She also noted that GFC and the Board would be kept informed throughout the process.

4. <u>Communicating Recommendations from General Faculties Council to the Board of Governors</u>

Presenter(s): Brad Hamdon, General Counsel and University Secretary

#### Discussion.

B Hamdon noted that the guidelines which were developed by the Board Governance Committee (BGC) and the GFC Executive Committee (Exec) had been used for the first time to communication a GFC recommendation at the December 9, 2022 Board of Governors meeting. He spoke about the GFC Committee of the Whole recommendations from Ferbruary 2021 related to a joint committee of GFC and the Board and the resulting collaboration between BGC and Exec to produce a protocol for communicating recommendations from GFC to the Board when additional measures may be required to improve communications and effective functioning of shared governance. He asked members for their thoughts on the implementation of the protocol in December.

Members discussed whether there had been any feedback from GFC members, an email from a GFC member that was received by some members of GFC regarding the protocol, and that BGC may have some feedback to offer once they have a chance to discuss the protocol at their March meeting.

A member offered an opinion that the culture of shared governance at the university was being damaged by major restructuring done to answer the financial issues imposed by government.

A member expressed that the process worked well and that GFC's message was communicated to the Board. She further noted that if the Board chose not to engage with the recommendation then that was beyond GFC's control.

A member noted that the protocol provided limited opportunity for the presenter to speak but that the process worked well.

B Hamdon explained that the protocol's limitations on the presenter's ability to speak beyond presenting the brief were intentional because it was not fair to ask one person to speak on behalf of GFC. He committed to reporting back after the BGC meeting in March.

14. Draft Agenda for the Next Meeting of General Faculties Council

#### Discussion.

Kate Peters, GFC Secretary, noted that the proposed changes to the Nominating Committee's terms of reference had not been discussed by GFC because the item had been deferred three times but that Exec did recommend these changes at their October 31, 2022 meeting. She also suggested that the proposed changes to the Executive Committee's terms of reference, and the Draft Undergraduate Embedded Certificate Framework could come to GFC as information items with an opportunity for GFC to provide feedback. Members were also asked to consider whether it was appropriate to re-introduce in-person meeting of GFC without a remote option.

Members discussed how to encourage more members to attend in person to allow for greater engagement. A member expressed that the remote option should remain for those who felt unsafe attending in person. A member noted that people were continuing to attend hybrid meetings when they were sick and should be

encouraged to rest and not attend at all. A members expressed the hope that the new voting system would help the hybrid meeting to run more smoothly. Members agreed that it was not the right time to have in person only meetings but that maybe that could be the goal for the fall.

Members discussed the timing of specific items on the GFC agenda, whether 30 minutes should be allocated for question period, and made amendments including moving the Executive Committee terms of reference and the Embedded Certificate Framework to information items with opportunity to provide feedback.

The motion was moved and seconded.

THAT the GFC Executive Committee approve, under delegated authority from General Faculties Council, the Agenda for the January 30, 2023 meeting of General Faculties Council, as set forth in Attachment 1, as amended.
