5. Professional Development Proposed Policy

6. Graduate Studies Management Solution (GSMS)Program - Admissions

A Smith, Project Manager presented. The current Admission process is decentralized with each department reviewing their own applications and in some cases, using their own processing systems. It's complicated, cumbersome and requires a considerable amount of manual labour. As well, it fails to provide a competitive edge in promoting graduate student success and as a result, the University is losing top tier applicants to other institutions. It cannot accommodate the projected growth of the graduate student population.

The new system will accelerate admission adjudication time and get highquality applications by providing a unified work and data flow, a comprehensive records system that provides clear views of pertinent details to all customers, and is paperless. Applicants will be able to monitor their application progression, view uploaded documentation status, supply additional information, communicate with their Graduate Advisor and receive and respond to an offer of admission.

The planned implementation date is October 1, 2015.

The GSMS team is looking for departments to participate by providing feedback and doing user acceptance testing. The feedback will be used to improve the system.

FGSR Associate Dean Harrington referred to the report as circulated in advance, reminding councillors that several provisions concerning graduate studies within the 2015-16 Calendar have been renumbered, and so departmental websites and handbooks that refer to the Calendar may need updates. She also reminded councillors to consider adopting specific departmental rules providing guidance to students, supervisors and examiners as to the requirements for an acceptable thesis in their discipline (with section 8.4.1 of the FGSR Graduate Program Manual making clear that specific departmental rules are encouraged).

Master's Recruitment Scholarships

Although there is no budget for Master's Recruitment Scholarships this year, there are more of them and decisions are made in house every week if possible. There are 10 weeks of offers with 4-5 per week, but the process has sped up. Some departments send 7-8 nominations, but not all of these are competitive. The criteria have remained the same, i.e. GPA, reference letters, etc. Applications are from all of the disciplines, and winners are also from across the disciplines. U of A students do not get priority. The scholarships are overallocated to compensate for students who choose not to come to the U of A.
