TD Bank Interprofessional Award Instructions

TD Bank Interprofessional Health Education Award

Awarded annually to a student from each University of Alberta Health Sciences faculty who demonstrates commitment to interprofessional health education.

Value

\$2,000

Conditions for Eligibility

Currently registered full-time in the final year of a:

- **Graduate degree** program in a department within the Faculty of Rehabilitation Medicine or in a department within the School of Public Health.
- OR
- **Undergraduate pre-licensure or degree-granting** program of study in a University of Alberta Health Science faculty.

The following are considered eligible health sciences faculties:

- Agricultural Life and Environmental Sciences
- Augustana Faculty
- Kinesiology, Sport, and Recreation
- Medicine & Dentistry
- Nursing
- Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences
- Public Health, School of
- Rehabilitation Medicine

Only students who have never received this award as a University of Alberta health science student are eligible to apply.

Selection Criteria

Applicants will be assessed and selected on the following:

- Satisfactory academic standing entering final year of program study.
- Clearly articulated identification and proposed integration of interprofessional competencies into future practice in the statement of intent.
- Activities contributing to the advancement of interprofessional education and/or collaborative practice.

Application Instructions

Provide:

- 300-500 words providing evidence of engagement with interprofessional learning, as defined by the University of Alberta Interprofessional Learning Pathway. More information regarding the Interprofessional Learning Pathway <https://www.ualberta.ca/health-sciences-education-research/ip-education/interprofessional-pathway>

- Examples of curricular learning experiences may be included. We strongly recommend the inclusion of co-curricular learning experiences. Co-curricular experiences can include volunteer experiences, elective structure learning experiences, or experiences gather in a work environment.
- A 300-500 word statement of intent describing how you will promote interprofessional learning and/or collaboration in the future. This may include activity undertaken as a student, or to be undertaken as a future practitioner.
- One letter of support from a health professional.

The Interprofessional Learning Pathway

The Interprofessional Learning Pathway is a curricular model of the University of Alberta, through the Health Sciences Education and Research Commons. The Interprofessional Learning Pathway is comprised of a series of progressive interprofessional learning experiences, through which health science students achieve competences in four interprofessional core competencies upon graduation: **communication**, **collaboration**, **role clarification**, and **reflection**. Interprofessional learning experiences within the Pathway involve direct interaction with other professionals (including virtual interactions, or reflection on those interactions).
