Purpose

The Postgraduate Medical Education Office allows for the possibility of granting a waiver of training after an approved leave of absence for Residents, in accordance with the policies of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) and the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC). The purpose of this policy is to outline the principles behind granting requests for a waiver of training.

Waivers of Training apply to residents in both time-based programs and in competency-based training. While the exit from training is based on demonstrated achievement in competency based training programs, time must still be considered in recognition of the formal agreements the University of Alberta holds with both the provincial government and the provincial health authority.

POLICY

The following principles apply to the granting of waivers of training:

- 1. Granting of a waiver of training after a leave of absence is considered to be the exception rather than the standard procedure.
- A waiver of training after a leave of absence does not mean that a resident can shorten training because
 they have performed well and would like to start practicing earlier than the planned end of the residency.
 Any commitments regarding new employment or a training position must be timed for when residency
 officially ends.
- 3. As it is a decision that does not affect a grade or the resident's academic standing, the decision to deny a waiver of training cannot be appealed.
- 4. Residents who are granted a waiver of training and go on to fail their certification exam are not entitled to additional funding to extend their residency.
- 5. A waiver of training must be approved by the Associate Dean, PGME.
