Notes:

- MLCS 210 should be taken in your first or second year. MLCS 410 should be taken in the final winter semester of your degree. MLCS 410 is offered in the Winter semester only. MLCS 495 (thesis) is taken in your final year, normally Fall term. Students doing combined honors replace MLCS 495 with INT D 520 and must apply to the Faculty of Arts Undergraduate Student Services by August 1.
- + Language requirement options:
 - 6 credits of a senior-level language in one single language (eg. UKR 211/212) **AND**
 - 12 senior-level credits continuing in the same language, **OR** 12 senior-level credits in an additional language, **OR** 12 additional senior-level credits in SLAV courses
 - The languages must be offered in MLCS. Depending on your placement, you may need to complete the introductory 100-level first. Slavic language options include Polish, Russian, Ukrainian.
- *SLAV 299/399/499 can be repeated if the topics vary. These credits can also be fulfilled with MLCS or C LIT courses if the content includes Slavic studies. Consult your academic advisor.
- Slavic language options include Polish, Russian, Ukrainian. Languages other than these must be offered by MLCS. Depending on your placement, you may need to complete the 100-level first.
- Experiential learning courses within this route normally include MLCS 210 (opt in), MLCS 410, SLAV 475 and L'viv Ukraine study abroad program. Experiential learning credits can also be met through MLCS courses that include [significant experiential learning components](#) appropriate to the area of study, Community Service-Learning (CSL), Arts Work Experience (AWE), OR a study abroad experience. Six credits total, in any combination. For help with the experiential learning component consult the academic advisor to access our Experiential Learning Guide.
