Notes:

- MLCS 210 should be taken in your first or second year. MLCS 410 should be taken in third or fourth year of your degree. MLCS 495 (thesis) is taken in your final year, normally Fall term. Students doing combined honors replace MLCS 495 with INT D 520 and must apply to the Faculty of Arts Undergraduate Student Services by August 1.
- + 36 credits at the senior-level in Spanish OR split between Spanish and another language (with at least 12 credits in each). **Depending on your language placement, you may need to complete SPAN 111/112/211/212 before completing the other course requirements.** SPAN 211/212 and above count towards the 54-60 credits of your major. If you have never studied Spanish, start in SPAN 111. If you have completed Spanish 30 (grade 12) in high school, register in SPAN 211. If you grew up in Canada but speak Spanish at home, register in SPAN 306. SPAN 300 is intended for students who have completed SPAN 211/212. For any questions, consult with the Spanish Language Coordinator. Required courses that you are not eligible to take may be substituted with any other SPAN 3XX or SPAN 4XX to make up the credit.
- Special topics courses (X98, X99) can be taken multiple times if topics vary.
- Immersive experiences are done through study abroad, eg. Cuba, Mexico, or Spain. CSL courses can be taken in Spanish or in other MLCS courses if they are language immersive.
