Consists of a survey of historical and contemporary relationships between Indigenous peoples and newcomers, with the aim of expanding the understandings of these relationships.	<b>NS 420</b> the theory and practice of creating partnerships and public movement building; governance techniques that include interest based negotiations, meeting facilitation and building public narrative.
	<b>NS 152</b> general introduction to Plains Cree (Y dialect) grammar and vocabulary, with practice in speaking and work in the language laboratory.	<b>NS 430</b> the interplay of the theory and actual practice of Indigenous governance.
Master of Arts (Native Studies)  Doctor of Philosophy (Indigenous Studies)	<b>NS 520/620</b> introduces students to the history of and various theoretical concepts deemed important to the discipline of Native Studies.
