Graduate Ethics Training

The University's graduate ethics training requirement is met in conjunction with the Psyco 502, "Professional and ethical issues in Psychology," which all new students take in their first term. The requirement is fulfilled with three components:

- 1. Students will take the GET WebCT course developed by FGSR.
- 2. One two-hour class will be devoted to an overview of the principles underlying animal and human research ethics (with suitable required readings).
- 3. An additional six hours of instruction will be devoted to professional ethics, human research ethics, and animal research ethics. Normally, this class time will be devoted to guest appearances by experts in these domains. For example, the guest speakers may be faculty who are currently on the respective research ethics boards.
