The Department of Agricultural, Food and Nutritional Science (AFNS) at the University of Alberta is inviting Notice of Interest from current members of the Faculty of ALES for nomination to a Tier I Canada Research Chair in the area of Human Nutrition and Metabolism. They should be a Full Professor, or possess the necessary qualifications to be appointed to this level. The successful applicant will be nominated by the University for a Canada Research Chair and will also be appointed as a regular senior faculty member. The successful candidate will be expected to develop a broad translational program in Human Nutritional Sciences, Metabolism and Chronic Disease(s). The successful candidate will be an ambassador for research excellence and forge a strong collaborative network within the Division of Human Nutrition, Department of AFNS. The incumbent will play a leadership role in understanding and promoting Nutritional Health in Chronic Disease(s) such as Diabetes and Cancer, and will be expected to align with the mandates in areas of excellence within the University of Alberta, including (but not limited to) the Alberta Diabetes Institute and the Alberta Cross Cancer Institute.

This competition is restricted to current full-time tenure-track members of the Faculty of Kinesiology, Sport, and Recreation. In accordance with the requirements of the CRC program, and to ensure the University of Alberta CRC allocation addresses the representation gap for four designated groups, this competition is restricted to women, including women with disabilities, Aboriginal Peoples, and visible minorities.

The successful candidate must have a PhD in Physical Education, Kinesiology, Recreation, or a related field. Nominees must be Assistant or Associate Professors. The successful candidate will be expected to develop a multi- or interdisciplinary research program examining issues relating to disability in a range of movement contexts (e.g., sport, recreation, dance, performing arts). The successful candidate will be an ambassador for research excellence and will forge a strong collaborative network within the Faculty of Kinesiology, Sport, and Recreation, its affiliated institutes and centres, and with other faculties across the University of Alberta. The candidate will possess expertise in a range of innovative research methodologies, including community-based research, and will be able to foster strong partnerships with community members and organisations. The candidate will provide leadership in terms of fostering research, creative works, and knowledge translation activities in the area of Disability and Movement Studies.

We are seeking an individual with an outstanding record of research accomplishments, a vibrant and growing research program, and whom do peers acknowledge as an emerging leader Disability and Movement Studies. The candidate will have the vision and talent essential to build a successful collaborative research program that crosses institutional and disciplinary boundaries. The successful candidate will have dedicated research time and be expected to teach graduate level courses, take on graduate supervision, and engage in some administrative committee work.

The University of Alberta, one of Canada's premier research institutions, offers an excellent research environment. Goals of the 2016-2021 Strategic Plan include striving to better reflect, accommodate, encourage, and support diversity by creating an inviting and inclusive environment; delivering accessible and inclusive physical activity and recreation programs; and, providing mentorship to faculty and staff.

The CRC Program is subject to both the *Canadian Human Rights Act* and the federal *Employment Equity Act*. The *Employment Equity Act* mandates proactive practices to increase the representation of four designated groups: women, people with disabilities, Aboriginal peoples, and visible minorities. The Act requires the removal of barriers that disadvantage members of the four designated groups.

In keeping with its obligations under the *Employment Equity Act* and in response to a human rights complaint that alleged the CRC Program discriminated against individuals from the four designated groups, the CRC secretariat released an [Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Action Plan](#). The laudable aims of the CRC Action Plan are to identify and eliminate barriers to CRCs for members of the designated groups; to put into place positive policies and practices to ensure the effects of systemic barriers are eliminated; and to ensure appropriate representation of designated group across CRCs. Generally speaking, special programs designed to eliminate systemic discrimination and increase underrepresentation of target groups are viewed as being consistent with human rights legislation.

As part of the CRC plan, universities had to post their own action plan on their website by December 15, 2017. Action plans include a description of the institution's equity targets and gaps for each of the four designated groups and set out indicators and actions that will enable swift progress towards meeting the institution's equity targets and goals by December 2019. Applicants must be emerging scholars, normally no more than 10 years from their highest degree at the time of nomination, and must be eligible for SSHRC funding. Exceptions will be made for applicants who are more than 10 years from having earned their highest degree and have experienced legitimate career interruptions (including maternity or parental leave, extended sick leave, clinical training, and family care). Career interruptions will be assessed through the CRC program's Tier 2 justification process.
