The School of Library and Information Studies and the Digital Humanities Program offer a combined MA in Digital Humanities/MLIS program that students can complete within three years. Students are required to complete a minimum of $\star 45$ in coursework and a thesis.

Students pursuing the combined degree must take $\star 12$ in Digital Humanities required courses and $\star 6$ in Digital Humanities options. They must also take $\star 18$ in Library and Information Studies required courses and $\star 9$ in LIS options. The MLIS requirement to complete $\star 6$ from a list of designated Information Technology courses is fulfilled by content covered in the Digital Humanities courses.

Units of Course Weight (commonly referred to as credits) are represented by the symbol $\star$ here and in the University Calendar.

Students are strongly encouraged to take the required Digital Humanities courses during their first year. Students must also complete a thesis. The student's thesis committee should normally include faculty members from both programs.

A full-time student who is registered for the joint MA/MLIS degree normally will be able to complete the degree requirements in three years.
