This list was last updated in January 2024. The deadlines provided give an idea of when applications are expected, however, users are strongly encouraged to look at updated deadlines for the current year by going to the scholarship's website.

Tips for Essays

- Choose aspects of your life that are unique and make you stand out, but ensure you are comfortable talking about them. Ensure you connect your experiences to the applicable topic.
- Keep your essays! Many scholarships ask for essays on the same or similar topics. By keeping your essays, you can repurpose them and save time.

Tips for Letters of Recommendations

- Try to ask for letters of recommendation well ahead of the deadline.
- Try to pick people who know you on a personal level.
- It is okay to ask for updates on the status of your recommendation letter: just be polite.
- Make sure to say thank you afterwards!



Academic

[Dr. Ernest and Minnie Mehl Scholarship](#) | \$3,500

One \$3,500 scholarship awarded to a student enrolled in a post-secondary degree-granting program, based on academic achievement in the grade 12 diploma exam, and the same course requirements as for the Rutherford Scholars Award. No specific deadline.

[U of A Academic Excellence Scholarship](#) | \$6,000

The University of Alberta offers automatic consideration for this scholarship, valued up to \$6000, to the top 5% of students in each faculty. No application is required.

[U of A Entrance Scholastic Distinction Scholarships](#) | \$50,000

The University of Alberta provides approximately 60 scholarships valued up to \$50,000 to students who maintain an average of approximately 95%+ in grades 10, 11 & 12, provide an academic reference and student essay, and apply before the mid-December deadline.

[Information Security Undergraduate Scholarship](#) | \$5,000

This scholarship awards up to \$5000 to 20 students pursuing, or planning to pursue, a degree with a focus on cybersecurity, information assurance, or a similar field in the fall of 2024. Students in high school, undergraduate, graduate, or postgraduate programs are eligible to apply. The deadline is February 29th.

[Lionel High School Chemistry Award](#) | \$16,000

This scholarship is available to high school students who are permanent Canadian residents, have an interest in chemistry-related studies, and plan to enroll in a Bachelor of Science program at a Canadian university. The award is intended to provide financial assistance to those who would not be able to attend post-secondary education without significant financial aid. The deadline is March 1st.

[Jo-Ann Koch for Bright Children Society Scholarship](#) | \$1,500

One award valued at \$1500 each for students enrolled full time in the second or subsequent year in chemical engineering, nursing, or social work in Alberta.

[Esther and Peter Cunliffe Scholarship](#) | \$1,500

Varying number of awards valued at \$1500 for graduating high school students from Edmonton Public Schools who are Canadian citizens or landed immigrants and residents of Alberta. Applicants must have excellent academic performance, outstanding personal and leadership



qualities, and demonstrate financial need. Applicants must also have conditional acceptance from U. of A., NAIT, or MacEwan. Deadline is May 1st (2023).

[Keyera Energy-Peter J. Renton Memorial Scholarship](#) | \$6,000

The Keyera Energy-Peter J. Renton Memorial Scholarship is worth up to \$6,000 (\$3,000 in the first year, \$3,000 in the second year of post-secondary education). The scholarship is available to students planning to enroll full-time in an Alberta post-secondary institution in a field of study related to the oil and gas industry. Applicants must provide three reference letters.

[Catherine and Robert Povaschuk Scholarship](#) | \$1,500

The Catherine and Robert Povaschuk Scholarship is worth \$1,500 and is available to students registered at an EPSB school who have honors standing in academic classes, meet the entrance requirements for their chosen program, and has conditional acceptance to the University of Alberta. Deadline is May 1st (2023).

[MindFuel Scholarship](#) | \$2,500-5,000

Three scholarships worth \$2500 to \$5000 each for students entering 1st year in an undergraduate science, applied science degree or science education at an Alberta post-secondary institution. Deadline July 31st (2023).

[AI Hamilton Scholarship](#) | \$2,000

A \$2000 per year award for a maximum of 4 years (\$8000) for students entering first-year post-secondary education with outstanding academic, athletic, and community leadership achievement, and financial need. Deadline June 11 (2023).

[Nancy Fairley Scholarships](#) | \$3,000

Three scholarships worth \$3000 each for students attending a college or university in Alberta, with a full IB program, high academic standing particularly in IB English 30, and leadership at the school and community level. Deadline June 30.

[Anna and John Kolesar Memorial Scholarship](#) | \$1,500

\$1500 scholarship for a student with the highest academic average in three designated subjects, planning to enroll in a Faculty of Education, and from a family where neither parent has a university degree. Deadline October 31st.

[The Bill Kehler Memorial Scholarships](#) | \$2,500

consist of 4 scholarships valued at up to \$2500 each. They are available to students who have completed grade 12 and are pursuing post-secondary education with academic interests in



broadcasting or agriculture. Individuals in professional rodeo can also apply. The application deadline is August 1st.

[Lift Parts Express Scholarship](#) | \$500

\$500 scholarship for Canadian high school seniors enrolled for the fall of 2023. Deadline is April 30th.

[Orville Erickson Memorial Scholarship](#) | \$4,000

Varying number of scholarships valued up to \$4000 for students pursuing education in the field of conservation in Canada. Deadline is May 25.

[Tiessen Foundation Broadcast Scholarship](#) | \$750

\$750 - Deadline: June 1 - For students pursuing post-secondary studies in broadcasting at a Canadian institution.

[The Child Care Career Scholarship](#) | \$2,500

offered by the Government of Alberta, provides varying numbers of awards valued at \$2500 to students entering their first year of post-secondary education and enrolled full-time in a recognized post-secondary program in early learning and child care education. Applicants must have completed Early Learning and Child Care courses while in high school and be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. The application deadline is ongoing and can be found on the website provided.

[Luke Santi Memorial Award](#) | \$1,000

\$1,000 award for a graduating high school student accepted into a physical science program at any Canadian university. Includes an opportunity to spend a 'day as a physicist' at the Perimeter Institute for a tour, lunch with researchers and staff, seminars or other scheduled events. Travel costs are covered. Deadline is May 31st.

Athletic

[Pat Fletcher Scholarship Foundation for Golf](#) | \$2,500

Varying amount of bursaries worth up to \$2500 for students with a dedication to their studies, a well-rounded lifestyle, an interest and ability in golf, and a respect for the traditions of the game. Deadline April 30th.

[Alberta Golf Association Foundation Scholarships](#) | -



Applications open May 1. Varying awards - Deadline: June 30 - For Alberta high school students with academic performance, financial need, participation in volunteer or community activities, and relevant work experience.

[Canadian Golf Foundation Scholarships](#) | \$4,000

Varying number of scholarships valued up to \$4000, renewable annually up to 4 years for a high school graduate with an 80% average who can provide proof of competitive golf at the national, provincial, and municipal level and is planning on attending a Canadian University or College. Deadline is July 3 (2023).

First Nations, Métis, Inuit

[Alberta Blue Cross Indigenous Scholarships](#) | \$1,500

Six scholarships valued at \$1500 are awarded to Indigenous young adults across the province based on personal goals, financial need and community involvement. Must be enrolled in the first year of any full-time post-secondary certificate or diploma program of two or more years duration at an accredited post-secondary institution. Deadline: January 31st.

[RBC Future Launch Scholarship for Indigenous Youth](#) | \$10,000

Open to Status and non-status, Inuit or Métis students pursuing post-secondary studies. Will award 20 scholarships annually valued up to \$10,000 each per year (up to 4 years). Deadline: February 7th.

[Canadian Aboriginal Writing & Arts Challenge Historica Canada](#) | \$100-2,000

varying number of awards valued \$100—\$2000. Open to First Nations, Métis, Inuit Canadians aged 9 to 29.

[Belcourt Brosseau Metis Awards Information](#) | \$2,000-10,000

Approx. 140 awards ranging from \$2000—\$10,000. Applicants must be Métis and intend to pursue a program of study leading to a recognized license, certificate, diploma, or degree. Based on financial need, connection to the Métis Community, and other circumstances. Full-time students entering the 1st year of their post-secondary program. Deadline March 31.

[Aboriginal Health Careers Bursary](#) | \$2,000-11,000

The Aboriginal Health Careers Bursary is worth between \$2,000 and \$11,000, and is awarded to First Nations, Inuit or Métis students who have been living in Alberta for the last three years. The applicant must be enrolled or planning to enroll in a health field at the post-secondary level



and must demonstrate financial need, be involved in the First Nations, Métis, Inuit community, and have experience in the healthcare industry.

[Bayer CropScience Scholarship for Future Leaders in Agriculture](#) | \$5,000

The Bayer CropScience Scholarship for Future Leaders in Agriculture awards up to five scholarships worth \$5,000 each. To be eligible, applicants must be entering the first year of an eligible agriculture bachelor program and be Canadian citizens or permanent residents. The deadline is June 8 (2022).

[Indigenous People Paying for School](#) | -

The Indigenous People Paying for School website provides information on pathways for receiving bursaries or scholarships for Indigenous students.

[Métis and Non-Status Bursary Program](#) | -

Varying number of awards for Métis or Non-Status Indian students with financial need, who have been an Alberta resident for at least 3 years prior to applying, and demonstrate an investment in and commitment to First Nations, Métis, Inuit communities in Alberta. Deadline May 31.

[Husky Aboriginal Educational Award Programs](#) | \$3,500-5,000

Five bursaries worth \$3500 to \$5000 each for Canadian citizens of First Nations, Métis, Inuit ancestry who want a career in the petroleum industry, with financial need and required qualifications. Deadline September 30 (2023)

[The Atco Pipelines Aboriginal Education Awards Program](#) | \$500-1,500

offers varying awards (Merit Awards, Bursaries & Scholarships) ranging from \$500 to \$1500. Eligible applicants must be enrolled full-time in post-secondary education, have Indigenous ancestry, and originate from within 50km of ATCO Pipelines facilities. The application deadline is August 1st.

Community Service

[Kinsmen Club of Edmonton, Salute 2 Youth](#) | \$1,000

A \$1000 award and engraved plaque for a full-time grade 12 student committed to community service and enrolling in a full-time post-secondary program.

[TD Canada Trust Community Leadership Scholarships](#) | \$70,000



For high school students in their final year with a minimum of 75% grade average and community leadership experience. 20 scholarships valued at up to \$70,000 each, including full tuition for 4 years and \$7,500 for living expenses. Deadline is November 15.

[U of A Entrance Leadership Awards Competition](#) | \$1,000-20,000

More than 100 awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$20,000 are available to students entering an undergraduate degree program at the University of Alberta in September, who possess exceptional leadership qualities as demonstrated by community service and involvement, and who have an average of 80% or higher based on Grade 11 and/or Grade 12 final marks. The application is available through Bear Tracks, and the deadline is mid-December.

[Terry Fox Humanitarian Award program](#) | \$28,000

Open to Canadian citizens or landed immigrants who have graduated from high school or are graduating and planning to or already studying towards their first university degree or diploma at a Canadian university. Applicants must be involved in uncompensated humanitarian initiatives and have good academic standing. Deadline: February 1.

[Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Scholarship](#) | \$1,000

This scholarship is worth \$1000 and is available to all graduating high school students in Canada who have shown exemplary citizenship qualities in their communities through extensive community service, volunteerism, and humanitarian causes. The scholarship is merit-based and open to any post-secondary institution in Canada. The deadline is February 25th.

[Hal Rogers Endowment Fund](#) | \$1,000

Open to Canadian citizens or landed immigrants registered in a post-secondary institution. The applicant must demonstrate high ideals, quality of citizenship, knowledge of Kin, Canada, and financial need. Deadline: February 1.

[Canadian Association of Principals Student Leadership Award](#) | \$250

12 scholarships valued at \$250. Must be in the top 20 of their class and be a student leader participating in varying school activities. Nominated by high school principals. Deadline March 1st (2023).

[The Horatio Alger Jim Pattison Alberta & BC Scholarships](#) | \$5,000

offer 80 scholarships valued at \$5000 each to high school students with plans to enter a post-secondary institution. Eligibility requirements include critical financial need (\$50,000 or less annual net income per family), a good academic record (65% average), strength of character, demonstrated integrity, perseverance in overcoming adversity, and involvement in co-curricular and community activities.



[Karthiha Guruparan & Bill Winsor Scholarships](#) | \$6,000

Two awards valued at \$6000 each for one male and one female graduating student from the top 20% of their high school class. Applicants must have post-secondary acceptance to an undergrad commerce/finance/business degree/diploma and submit a personal essay of 200 words, 2 reference letters, and demonstrate academic and social contributions. Parents must not have Canadian Post-secondary education. Deadline is April 14th (2023).

[The Canadian Iranian Foundation Scholarship](#) | \$1,500

Intended to assist immigrant students who wish to pursue their academic goals, awarded to those who can demonstrate academic excellence, the ability to integrate and participate within the community through volunteer and extracurricular activities, and the need for assistance to pursue a higher education. Deadline is April 26th.

[Rose Margaret King Merit Awards](#) | \$1,000-3,000

A varying number of scholarships worth \$1000 to \$3000 for students pursuing post-secondary education in Alberta, with financial need and volunteer work/community service. Deadline May 1 (2023).

[Edmonton Community Foundation Awards and Bursaries](#) | \$1,000-6,000

Awards ranging from \$1000 to \$6000 for students from Edmonton and Northern Alberta who have a history of community leadership and involvement. Deadline May 15.

[Learning Matters Education Charity](#) | \$2,500

Six awards worth \$2500 each for students entering or enrolled in a full-time undergraduate program, with financial need, community involvement, academic excellence, and career objectives. Deadline May 31.

[The Jonathan Doody Memorial Scholarship](#) | \$750

\$750 (2 male recipients) - Deadline: June 13 - For students enrolling in first-year full-time undergraduate studies at the University of Alberta, who demonstrate strong moral character, community involvement, and a desire to improve.

[Peter Elzinga Family Foundation Scholarships](#) | \$600-2,000

\$600-\$2000 - Deadline: June 1 - Available to any individual who wishes to further their education or training, based on financial need, community involvement, and leadership.

[Laurie Billings Community Leadership Scholarship](#) | \$1,000



Up to \$1000 - Deadline: June 17 (2018) - For students with conditional acceptance into a post-secondary institution, who have a combined grade 12 average of 70%, and demonstrate exceptional community involvement and financial need.

[Edmonton Refugee and Emerging Communities Awards](#) | \$1,000-2,000

The Edmonton Refugee and Emerging Communities Award (EREC) is a program of the Africa Centre. This scholarship provides financial assistance ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,000 to refugees and emerging communities in greater Edmonton. The goal is to support education that will increase the recipient's ability to obtain employment or pursue higher education.

[John Vandeborn Memorial Scholarship Program Belmead Community League Scholarships](#) | \$500

\$500 - Deadline: June 30 (2023) - For students with parents living in Belmead and who are community league members for at least 1 year, with strong academic achievement, good character, and school/community involvement.

[Delta Upsilon International Fraternity](#) | \$1,000

Multiple scholarships available for students who demonstrate promise and commitment towards community involvement and have an academic average based on admission average to U of A. Deadline: August 27th (2021).

French

[French for the Future National Essay Contest](#) | \$1,000-20,000

Open to Canadian students in grades 10-12 with French as a Second or First Language. [Participating universities](#) include U of Alberta and U of Lethbridge. Deadline is November 1.

[French Bilingual Award](#) | \$250

The French Bilingual Award is worth \$250 and is awarded to a student registered at an EPSB school who demonstrates excellent overall programming of French, positive attitudes in learning French, perseverance and growth as a language learner, and positive contributions in French class, as well as the use of the French language outside the classroom. Deadline is May 1st (2023).

Essay Contest

[Mensa Canada Essay Writing Scholarship](#) | \$2,000



This scholarship offers up to \$2000 to students who can describe their career plans and how they intend to achieve their goals. The deadline to apply is January 31st, and interested students can visit the Mensa Canada website for more information.

[PHI DELTA KAPPA Future Educators Award](#) | \$1,000

Open to Grade 12 students in Alberta who want to become a teacher and plan to attend post-secondary in the province. Applicants must submit a 1000-word essay describing why education is their chosen field of study and their vision of a day in the life of a teacher. No application form, just the essay. Deadline: February 1.

[RE/MAX “Quest for Excellence” Bursaries](#) | \$1,000

16 bursaries valued at \$1000 each. Applicants must write an essay on one of 5 subjects: Leadership, Sports, Technology or Trades, Fine Arts, Performing Arts, or Community/volunteer service, leadership. Deadline March 9.

[LM Scholarship](#) | \$500

The LM Scholarship is worth \$500 and is available to students who will be enrolled in a minimum two-year program in fall 2023. Applicants must be residents of Canada and studying in Canada or the United States. To apply, students must submit an essay about a situation where better safety procedures would have prevented an injury, explaining in detail what safety procedures they believe should have been in place and how they would have prevented the injury.

Women

[Persons Case Scholarship](#) | \$1,000-5,000

Varied number of awards in value from \$1,000-\$5,000 recognizing students whose studies will contribute to the advancement of women who are studying in fields where women are traditionally few based on a program of studies, academics, and community involvement.

[CERES Alberta Women's Fraternity Scholarship](#) | \$250

This scholarship offers three awards valued at \$250 each. Female students enrolling in their first year at the University of Alberta and who appreciate rural life while actively participating in school and extracurricular activities are eligible to apply. The deadline to apply is January 1st.

[Young Woman of Vision Bursary](#) | \$1,500

This annual bursary is valued at \$1500 and is awarded to a student attending MacEwan University in their first year of full-time studies who demonstrate financial need. Interested



students can contact the MacEwan Student Awards Office for more information. The deadline to apply is January 31st.

[Don and Norine Lowry Awards for Women of Excellence](#) | \$6,000

Two awards worth \$6000 each for female students in Edmonton pursuing a program of study in the fields of water, power, finance, energy, accounting, healthcare, safety, and/or community relations leading to a recognized certificate, diploma, undergraduate or graduate degree, or professional designation, with volunteer and leadership experience and financial need. Deadline May 31.

[The Ladies' Auxiliary to the Royal Canadian Legion, Alberta-N.W.T. Command Bursaries](#) | \$500

offers varying numbers of \$500 bursaries to children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren of ex-service personnel, RCMP, and firefighters entering their first term of post-secondary education, with demonstrated financial need. The application deadline is August 31st.

Students with Disabilities

[Canadian Hard of Hearing Association Scholarships](#) (4 different scholarships available) | \$1,000-2,000

Post-Secondary students, registered in a full-time program. Applicants must be hard of hearing, deafened, or oral deaf. Academic achievement, determination to cope with hearing loss, and community involvement. Deadline is March 1.

[Kids Cancer Care Scholarship](#) | \$1,000-7,500

A one-time award for child cancer survivors or those currently diagnosed with cancer based on the quality of their application and level of financial need. Deadline is April 15th.

[Betty Finch Scholarship](#) | \$1,000

A \$1000 award for students registered at an EPSB school and graduating in the current year, who have a learning disability, financial need, and have conditional acceptance at an Alberta post-secondary institution. Deadline May 1 (2023).

[The Spina Bifida Association of Northern Alberta Scholarship](#) | \$1,000

offers 1 or 2 scholarships of \$1000 each to Spina Bifida or hydrocephalus students selected based on motivation, maturity, and academic background. The application deadline is August 31st, and interested applicants can contact the organization via email for more information.



[Education for Life Bursary](#) | \$300-1,000

Scholarships valued from \$300 to \$1,000 for students with disabilities who are members of the Alberta Committee of Citizens with Disabilities or apply for membership and starting their first year of post-secondary training. Deadline is November 15.

Employment/Membership

[High School Apprenticeship Scholarship Program](#) | \$1,000

500 scholarships of \$1,000 each available to Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or protected persons who are Alberta residents and have completed the requirements for a high school diploma in June of their graduating year, are registered as an Alberta apprentice in the registered apprenticeship program, and/or with a Prior Learning Assessment, and have not been previous RAP/CTS or HSA scholarship recipients.

[Rick Malcolm Education Scholarship CUPE](#) | \$1,000

\$1000 award for a CUPE Alberta member or immediate family, limited to spouses and children, of a CUPE Alberta member enrolled in an approved post-secondary institution. Deadline is September 1.

[Advancing Futures Program](#) | up to \$40,000

Award of up to \$40,000 in education and living costs for residents of Alberta who have spent a minimum of 18 months in the care and/or custody of Alberta Children and Family Services, to begin full or part-time studies at approved institutions.

[The Al Larson Memorial Scholarship](#) | \$2,500

Alberta Realtor offers two \$2,500 scholarships based on academic performance and extracurriculars: to one student accepted into an academic university program and to one student accepted into a college or technical school program. The applicant must be a child or grandchild of an Alberta Realtor that is an AREA member. The deadline to apply is October 31.

[Syncrude Higher Education Awards Program \(SHEAP\)](#) | \$2,400

Several scholarships up to \$2,400 per year for children of past or present Syncrude employees who are under 25, based on academic achievement and course taken. Post-secondary program must be at least 2 years in length.

[Burger King Scholars Program](#) | \$1,000-5,000

This program provides varying awards valued at \$1000-\$5000 to students enrolled in a full-time post-secondary program who maintain high academic standing, demonstrate financial need,



participate in community service and extracurricular activities, and are either employed by Burger King or the dependent child of an employee. Deadline is December 15.

[Merit Contractors Association Scholarship](#) | \$1,500

This scholarship is intended to assist children of Merit member employees pursuing post-secondary education, including apprenticeship technical training. The scholarship is for one year and can be used at any accredited post-secondary institution. Applicants must be under the age of 25. Deadline is March 31 (2022).

[German Canadian Association of Alberta Undergraduate Scholarships](#) | \$2,500

The GCAA provides 2 awards valued at \$2,500 each to Alberta students that are entering their 1st or 2nd year of post-secondary, full-time studies. Applicants must have volunteered with a German organization or club. Deadline is March 31.

[RBC Children of RBC Employees Scholarship](#) | \$2,500

The RBC Children of RBC Employees Scholarship program awards 50 scholarships worth \$2,500 each. The awards are based on academic record, extracurricular activities, letters of reference, and an on-page essay dealing with career goals. The scholarship is available to children of RBC employees, and more information is available through the RBC website.

[Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria \(Canada\) Scholarships](#) | \$1,500

The Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria (Canada) Scholarships awards scholarships worth \$1,500 per year, renewable for four years. The scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic achievement to children of Knights of Columbus members in Canada.

[Veterans Bursary Program](#) | \$2,500

The Veterans Bursary Program awards several one-time bursaries worth \$1,300 to Class Members or their immediate family members who are enrolled in post-secondary education, full or part-time, at eligible institutions.

[NUPGE Tommy Douglas Scholarship](#) | \$2,500

\$2,500 scholarship for children, grandchildren including foster children and grandchildren of Public & General Employees current or retired, entering 1st year at a Cdn post-secondary. Requires a 750-1000 word essay. Deadline: June 30.

[IODE Coronation Bursary](#) | \$1,000



Two \$1,000 awards based on financial need for high school students entering any full-time degree-granting program in Alberta who have resided in Alberta for at least three years prior to application. Deadline: July 15.

[Mancap Foundation Legacy Educations Grants](#) | \$3,000

Six \$5,000 grants for first-year students studying at an accredited Alberta post-secondary institute in preparation for starting a business. Based on financial need, not academic excellence. Deadline: July 31.

[The Canadian Conference Bursaries IUOE](#) | \$750

Offers 10 bursaries of \$750 to children of IUOE members pursuing post-secondary education. The application requires a 1000-word essay and has a deadline of August 1st.

Arts

[Alberta Foundation for the Arts Grant Film and Video Arts scholarship](#) | \$7,000

\$7,000 awarded to a young Albertan who demonstrates talent and potential along with clear educational or training goals in the film and video arts. One scholarship awarded annually to an Albertan 25 years of age or younger. Deadline: March 1.

[Dr. MacEwan Literary Arts Scholarship](#) | \$7,000
