She was the first appointed Associate Dean of Science for Diversity at the University of Alberta and served in this position until her peaceful passing in 2019. Throughout her life, she worked as a tireless advocate for advancing gender inclusivity in STEM and was among the first to recognize the need to fix gender-biased systems. As a champion of diversity, she believed in the inalienable right that everyone has to fulfill their own potential.











Jessica Vandenberghe, born of the Dene Thá First Nation, is the Assistant Dean of Community and Culture at the University of Victoria's Faculty of Engineering and Computer Science.
