Recent productions include **We Decide – based on King Lear**, which weaves stories of homelessness and lack of agency in later life with Shakespeare's text, and **Trains We Remember**, a collection of reminiscences and images about train travel.

This is a CSL course.

Recent students have included PhD, Masters and undergraduates from Human Ecology, Public Health, Drama, Education, Native Studies and Women's Studies.
