- 2. External funding: Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC)

Scholarships help you to focus and plan your program

- Develop your grant/writing skills
- Reduce cost and workload (e.g.TAs, PT jobs)
- Enhance your CV
- Scholarships beget scholarship
- use template of application for other competitions


Canada Graduate Scholarships — Master's program (CGS-M)

- \$17.5K/year, one year (not renewable)
- must apply before or within month 12 of MA program
- Deadline 1 December [via SSHRC online portal]

Objective and Eligibility

- develop research skills, train high achieving undergraduate and early graduate students
- Canadian citizen, a permanent resident of Canada or a Protected Person
- be enrolled, will or have applied for full-time admission to
- eligible Canadian institutions (grad program with significant research component)
- have completed, as of December 31 of the year of application, betw. 0 and 12 months of the program

Application details

- Carefully read the <u>instructions</u>
- EDI commitment of SSHRC: <u>Black student researcher</u> <u>funding</u>, <u>Indigenous Scholars Awards and Supplements</u> <u>Pilot Initiative</u> (add. \$5k)
- Hard deadline: no late or incomplete application
- Adhere to <u>strict presentation standards</u>
- Indicate up to 3 eligible current or potential future host institutions (where you are studying/to which you will apply)

Application components

- 1. Online application form
- 2. Proposal proposed research project (1 page + 1 page references and citations)
- 3. Plain language abstract (1800 characters, incl. spaces)
- 4. Canadian common CV (online form)
- 5. Transcripts
- 6. 2 reference assessments

Reference (assessment) letters

- familiar with your research and abilities (current/previous prof, employment/volunteer supervisor)
- meaningful supportive commentary
- contact referees early at least 4 weeks
- Invitations section of your application: enter the required information for each referee and deadline
- Referees will receive an email with link to their reference assessment
- Provide referees with material (draft proposal, your cv, etc.)
- You cannot submit your application until after they submitted their assessment

The proposal - edit, edit, edit - seek feedback

- Good punchy title
- Be specific as possible
- Include background, context of current scholarship, objective/hypothesis, theoretical approach and methods (cite pertinent literature) & significance of the proposed research
- If not thesis/major paper program, clearly outline the research component of the degree.
- If you have not yet decided on a specific project, you must still provide a detailed description of a proposed research project. You may change your research direction or activities during the course of the award.

WHAT IS SSHRC LOOKING FOR? MA

- Academic excellence (record, scholarships/awards, duration, course load) - 50%
- Research potential (quality, originality, relevant work experience, training, significance and feasibility, previous research experience) - 30%
- Personal characteristics and interpersonal skills (work/leadership/management experience; clear communication in writing and oral formats, volunteer/community outreach) - 20%

Special circumstances

SSHRC will consider

- child-rearing/parental leave
- Illness
- Disability
- cultural or community responsibilities
- socio-economic context
- trauma and loss
- family responsibilities
- a pandemic.

WHAT MATTERS IN SSHRC APPLICATIONS (IN GENERAL)?

- Past academic results
- Program of study and its potential contribution to the advancement of knowledge
- Relevant professional and academic experience
- Referees

Start today!

- Read the instructions carefully and make a timeline for completion
- Proposal focused, significant, clear, concise
- Common CV
- Referees contact them as soon as possible
 - choose well -- you need positive and detailed assessments
 - make it easy for them provide all relevant information
 - Don't hesitate to ask part of the job
 - Deadline alert!
- get feedback on your proposal from your referees beforehand
