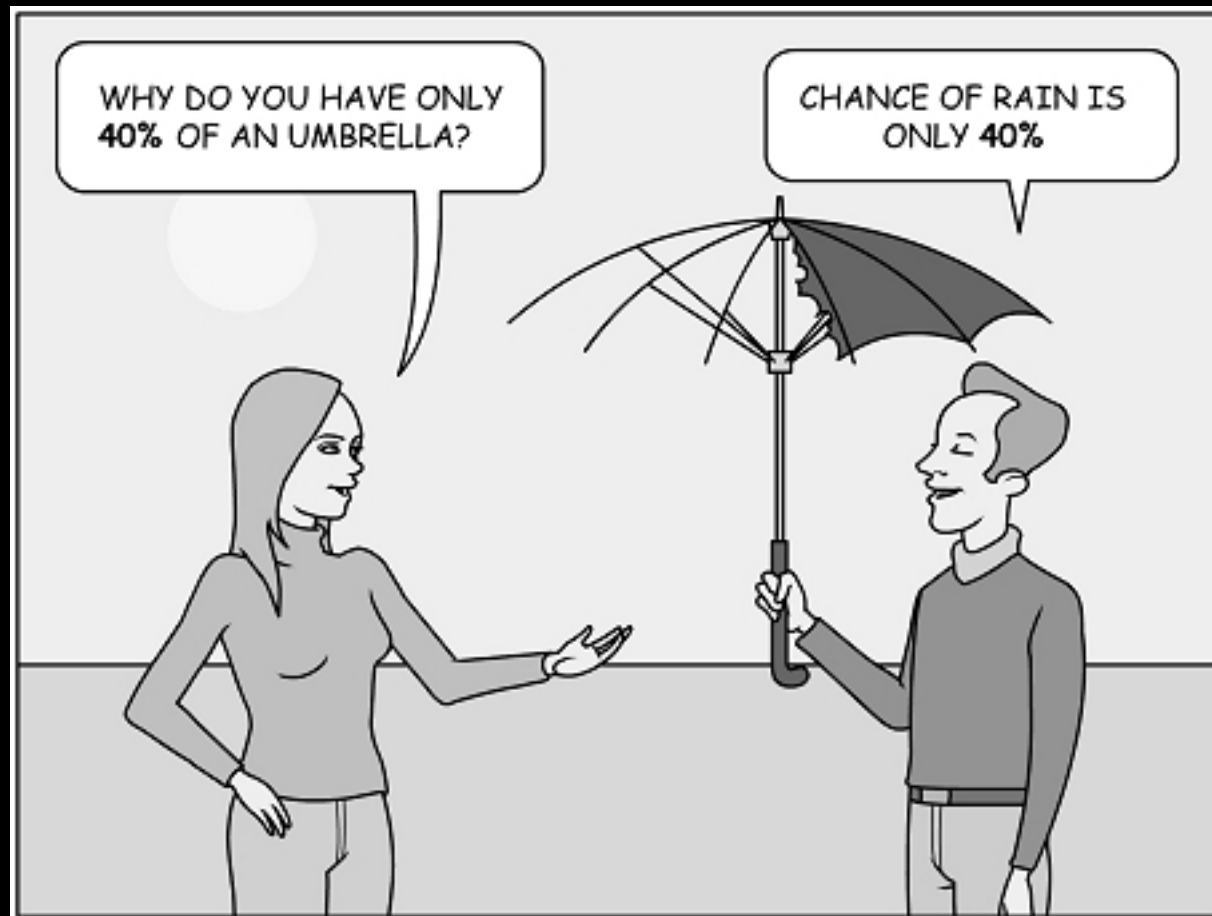

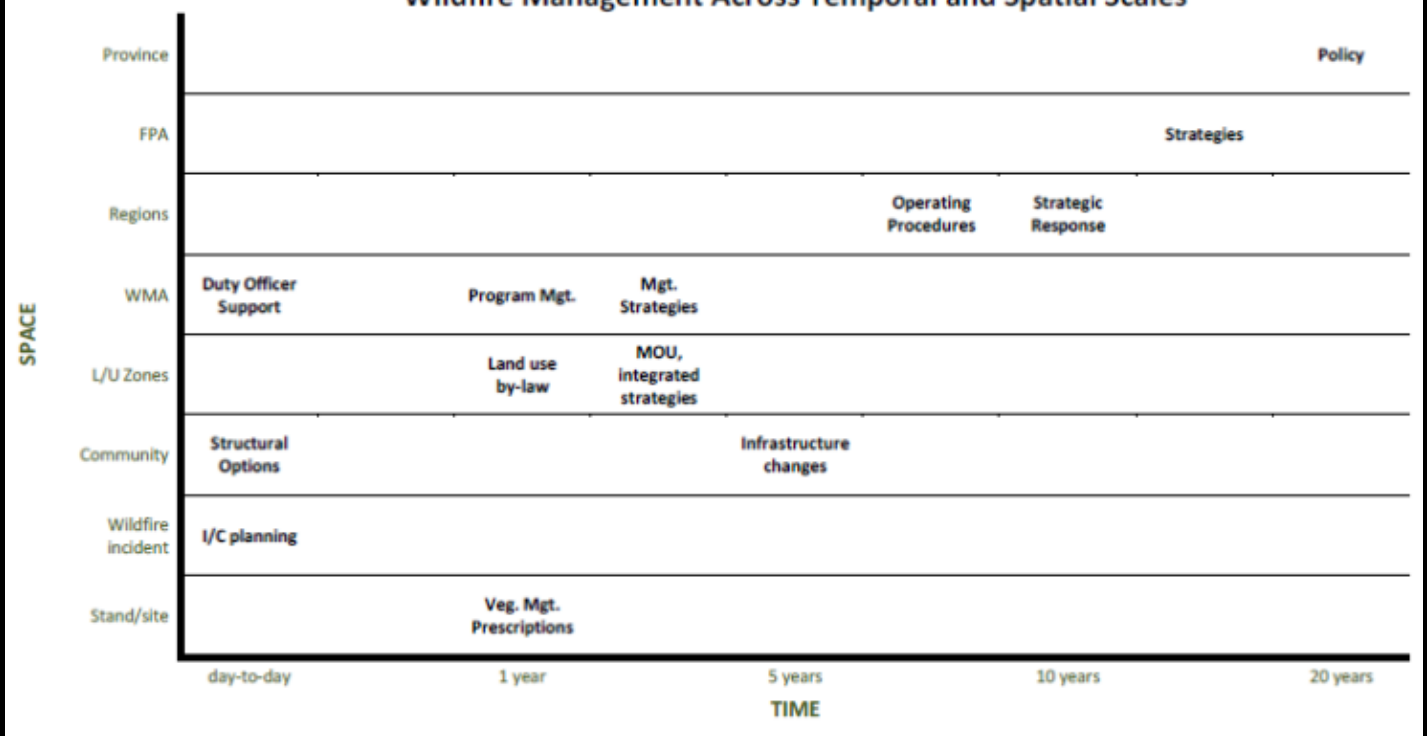

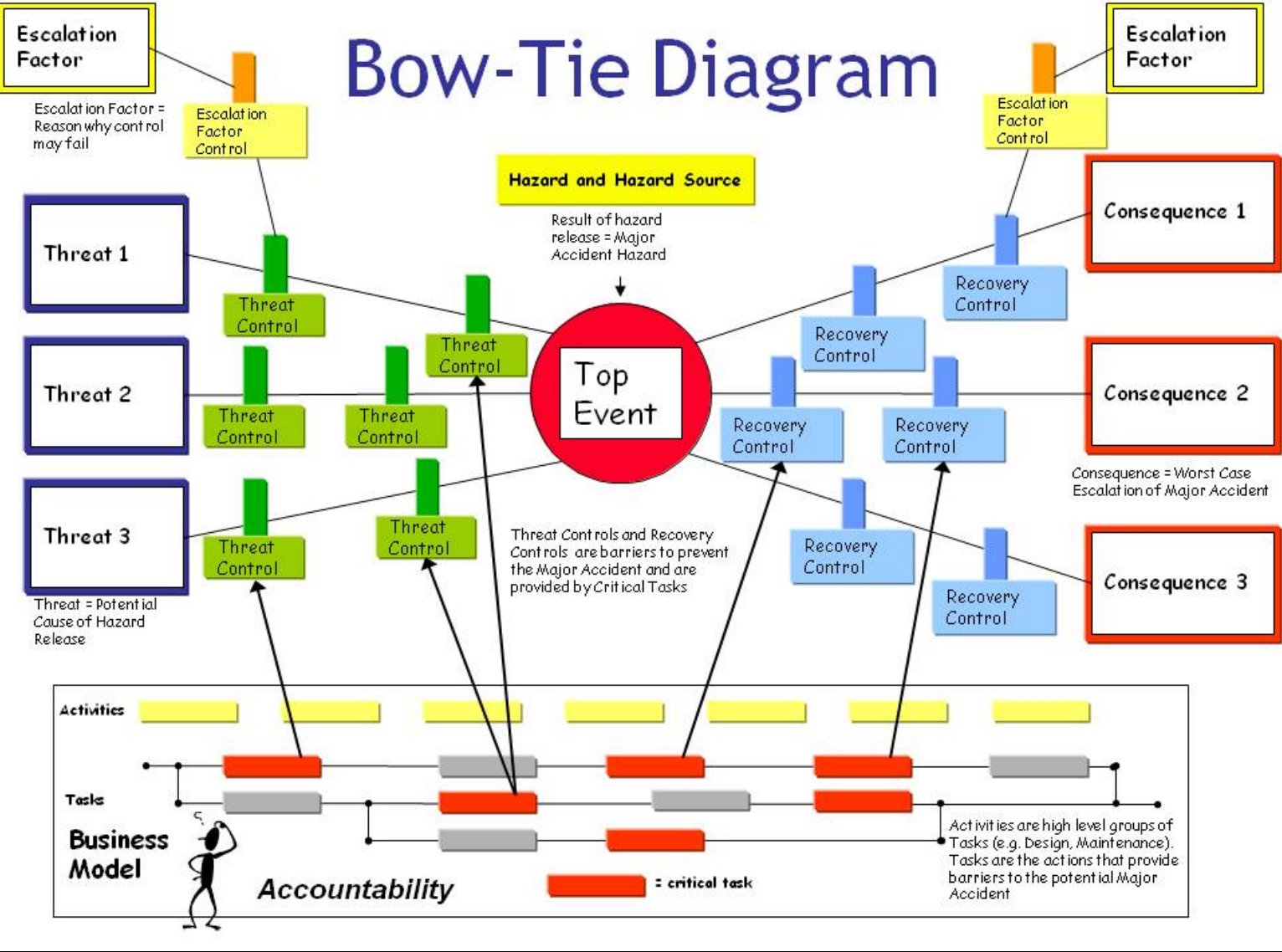


### Wildfire Management Across Temporal and Spatial Scales

## WILDFIRE MANAGEMENT POLICY
