





Set of conditions under which a wildland fire reaches beyond trees, brush, and other natural fuels to ignite homes and their immediate surroundings.

- 2003 OkanaganMountain Park, BritishColumbia
 - **■27,000** evacuated
 - →240 homes destroyed

WUI Fires in Canada with property loss

- May 2009 Halifax, Nova Scotia May 2012
 - ■1200 evacuated, 8 homes destroyed 10 damaged

WUI Fires in Canada with property loss

- ■2011 Slave Lake, Alberta
 - 430+ homes destroyed, 700+ left homeless
 - \$700 million (Canadian dollars) in insured losses



WILDLAND FIRES



Wildland fires are a serious threat to lives and property in the U.S. The combination of drought, warmer temperatures, high winds and an excess of dried vegetation in forests and grasslands has made fire seasons progressively worse over the past 50 years. In the past decade, wildfires have burned over 59 million acres of these lands. According to the National Interagency Fire Center (NIFC), 2012 saw one of the worst fire seasons in decades, with over nine million acres burned.



Reseach into Zoning and Regulatory Tools

Fire Protection Research
Foundation study on community
wildfire regulation found:

- Few adopt model codes
- Fewer enforce consistently
- One size does not fit all
- Planning and zoning tools have great potential to be effective in risk reduction
 - Siting, Design, Landscaping, Maintenance





